KINDERGARTEN READINESS

Common expectations for incoming kindergarten students according to NC Department of Public Instruction

Approaches to Learning

- Enjoys exploration through play
- Is confident in ability to learn
- Is persistent with challenging tasks

Social Emotional Development

- Plays cooperatively
- Follows basic rules
- Demonstrates independence
- Respects people & property

Language /Communication

- Speaks using complete sentences
- Follows multi-step directions
- Knows letters of his/her name
- Shows interest in books

Health & Physical Development

- Has required immunizations
- Receives medical care when sick
- Has regular dental check ups
- Gets 10-12 hours of sleep nightly
- Demonstrates self-help skills (toilet use, dressing self, washing hands)
- Uses scissors appropriately

Cognition & General Knowledge

- Identifies self by 1st & last name
- Names basic colors & shapes
- Knows actions has consequences
- Names some numbers , counts to 10

OVERVIEW OF KINDERGARTEN STANDARDS

English Language Arts

With prompting and support:

- Ask and answer questions about key details in a text.
- Retell familiar stories, including key details.
- Identify characters, settings, and major events in a story.
- Recognize common types of texts (e.g., storybooks, poems).
- Name the author and illustrator of a story and define the role of each in telling the story, feelings, & ideas.
- Actively engage in group reading activities with purpose and understanding.

Mathematics

- Count to 100 by ones and by tens.
- Count forward beginning from a given number within the known sequence (instead of having to begin at 1).
- Write numbers from 0 to 20. Represent a number of objects with a written numeral 0-20 (with 0 representing a count of no objects).

Science

- Understand the positions and motions of objects and organisms observed in the environment.
- Understand change and observable patterns of weather that occur from day to day and throughout the year.

Social Studies

- Explain how people change over time (self and others).
- Explain the impact of how life events bring change (a new sibling, moving to a new house, a new job, a new school, etc.).

THE BASICS

Is my child old enough?

- Your child must turn 5 on or before August 31, 2022, to enroll in a North Carolina public school.

What documents do I need to register my child for kindergarten?

- Proof of age (certified birth certificate)
- Court order of guardianship (if child is living with someone other than parent)
- Immunization record and NC Health Assessment form
- Proof of Residency (two documents)

6 Areas for Early Learning by NC ELI

- Social-Emotional: manages feelings, follows limits and expectations, interacts with peers, solves social problems
- Mathematics: counts, quantifies, connects numerals with quantities
- Language: Follows directions, tells about another time or place
- Literacy: notices and discriminates rhyme and alliteration
- Physical: uses fingers and hands
- Cognitive: attends and engages
