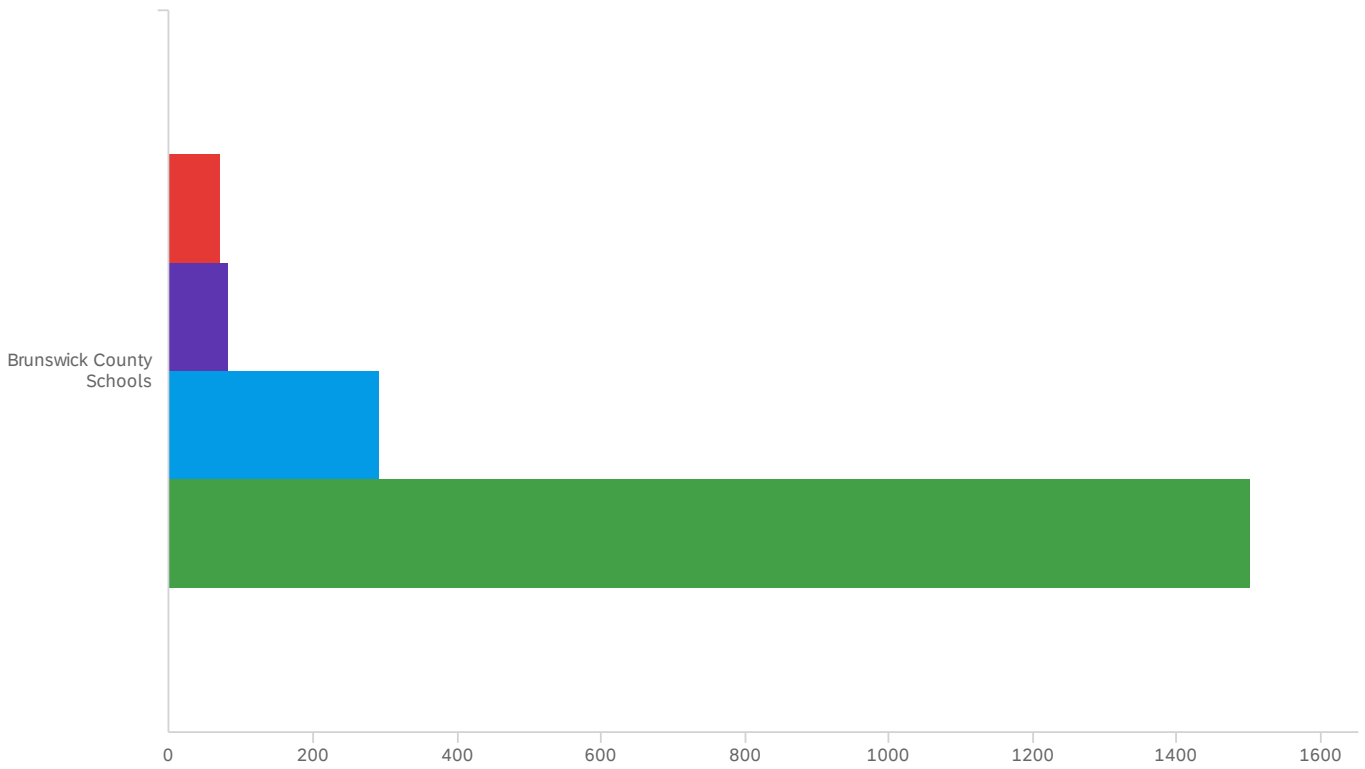

Q10 - What best describes your student's typical internet access?

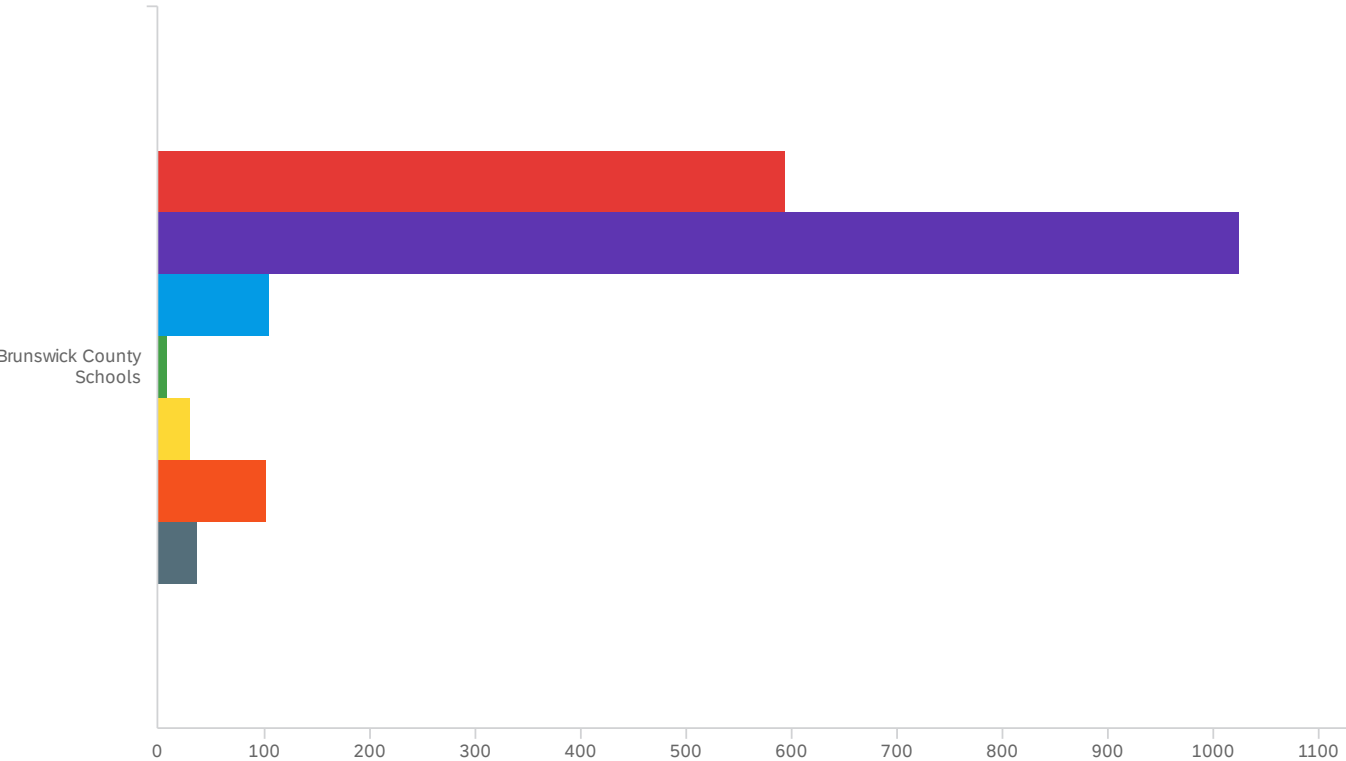

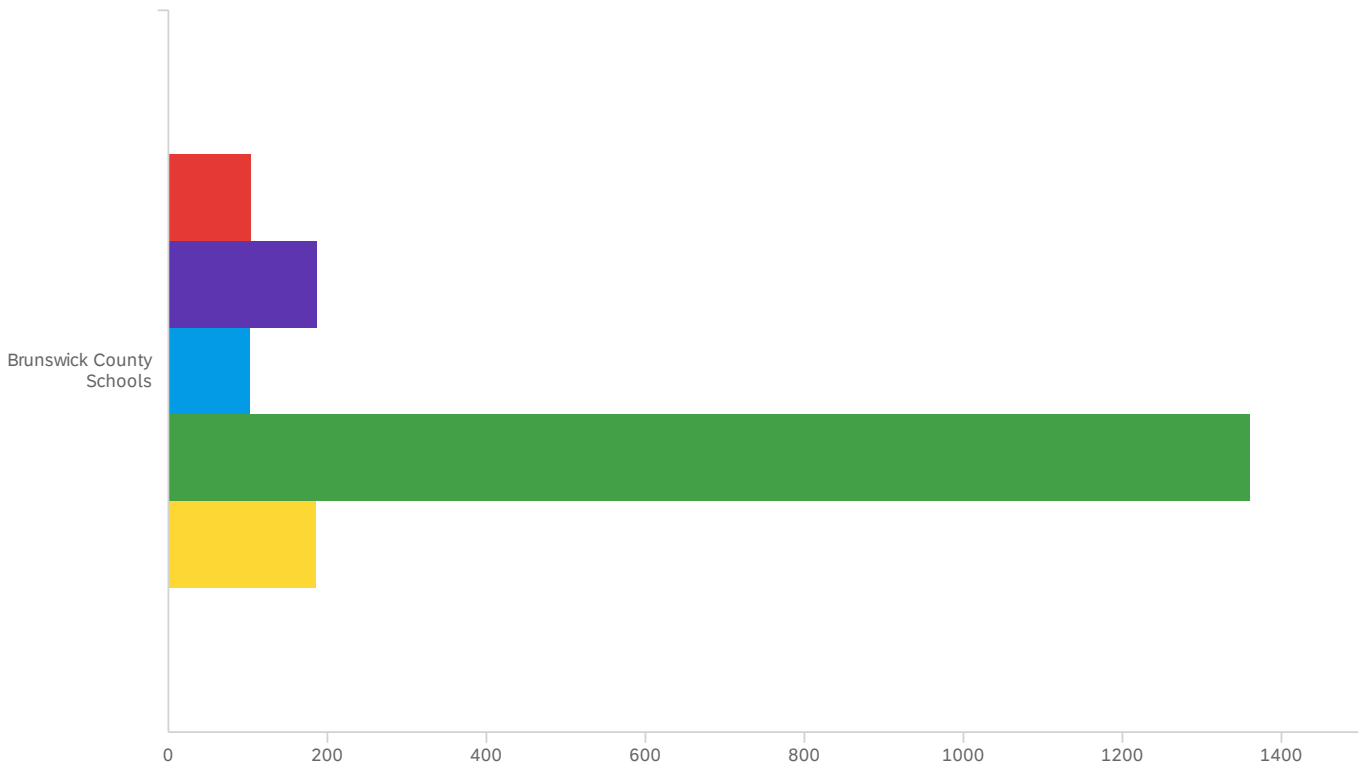

### Q9 - What tool did your child use to access remote learning?



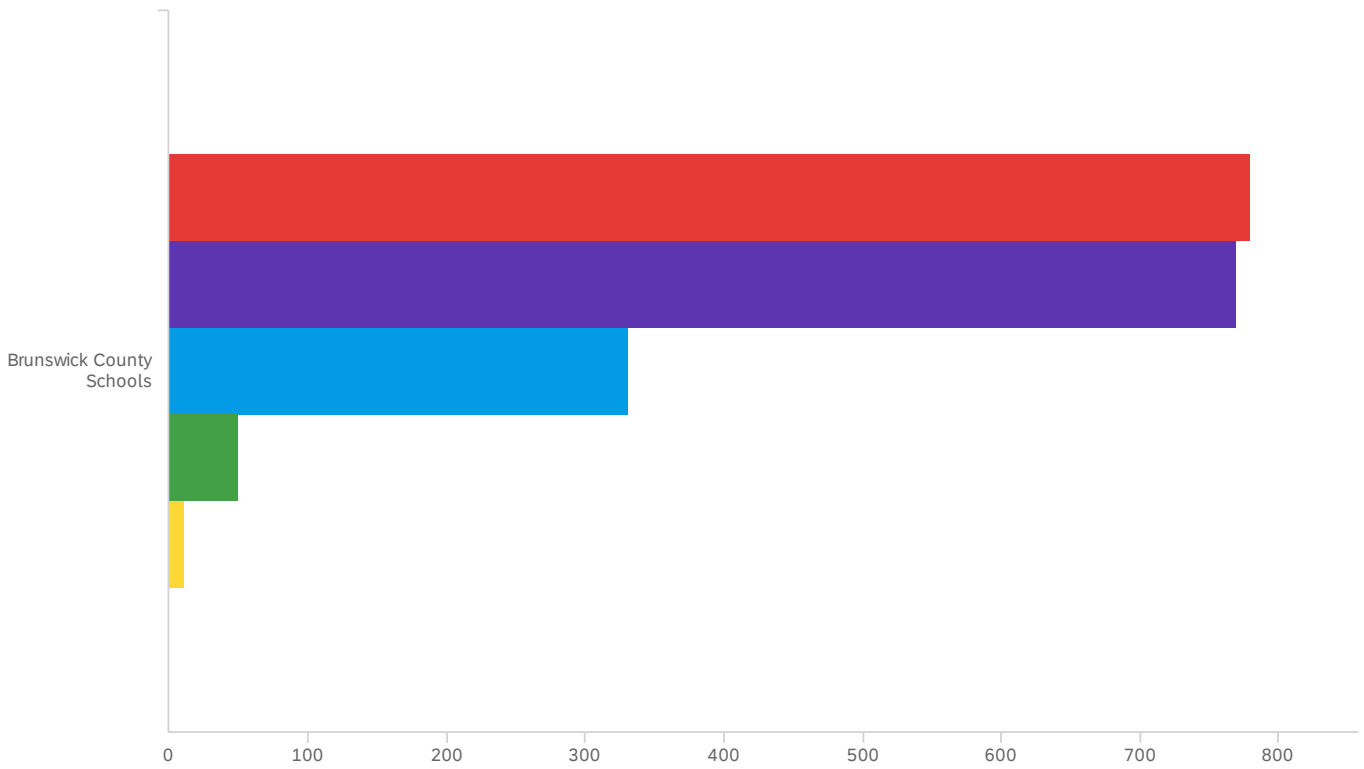

Q6 - How much of the day did your student participate in remote learning activities from their...



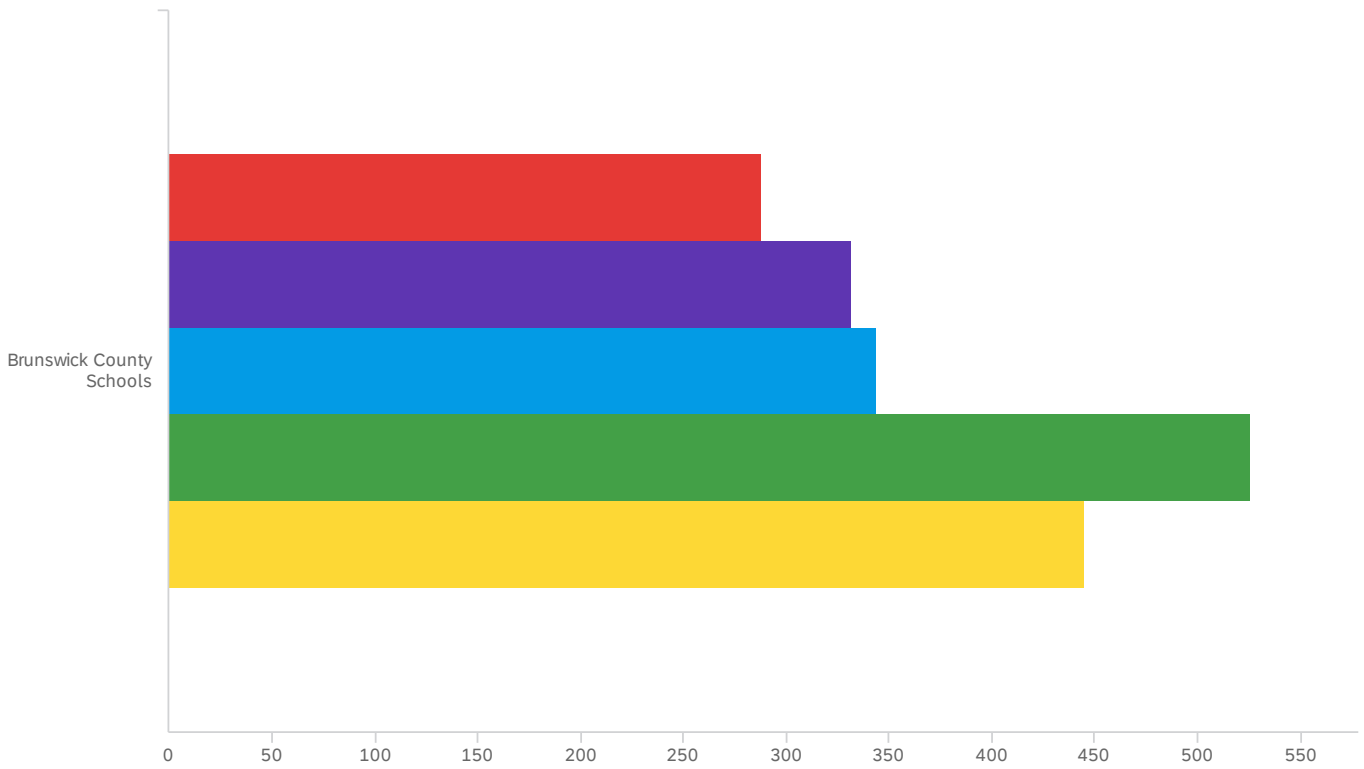

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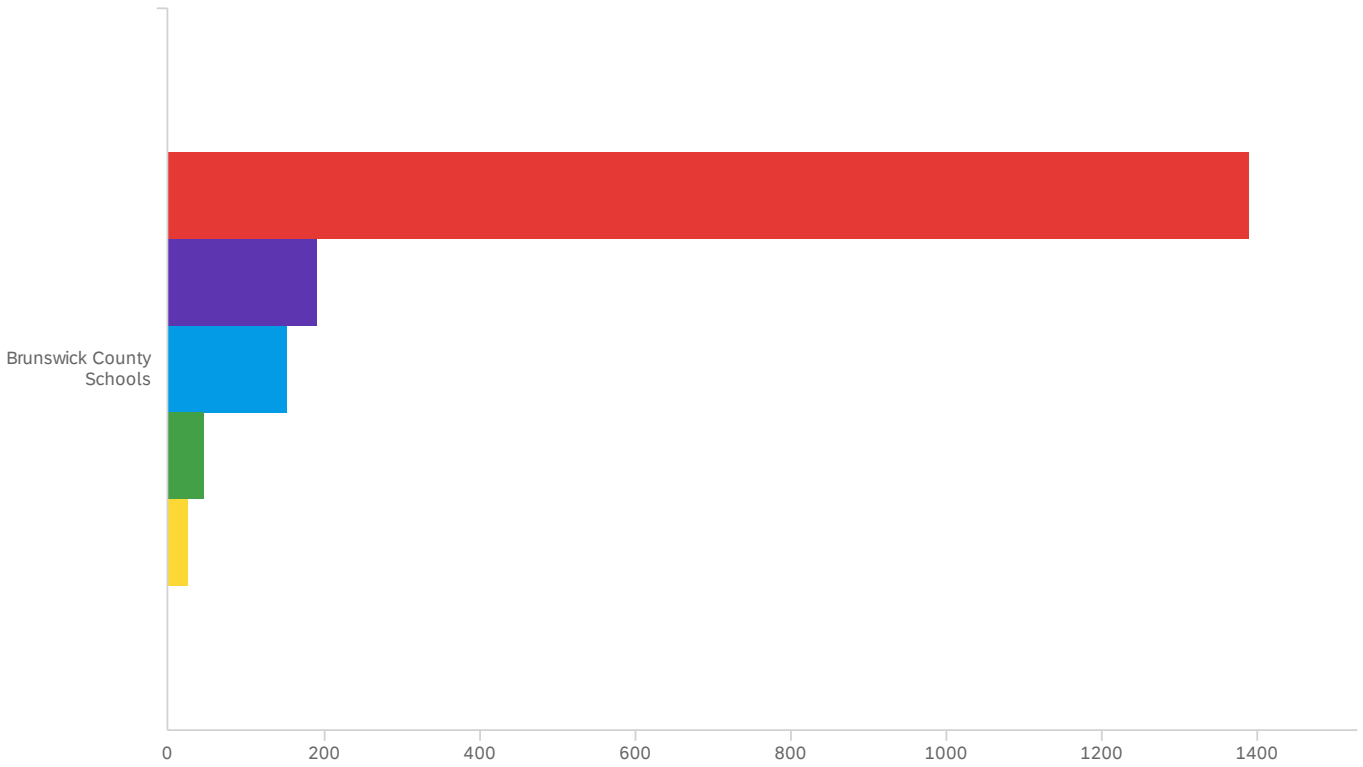








Q7 - How much of the day is your student caring for another family member?

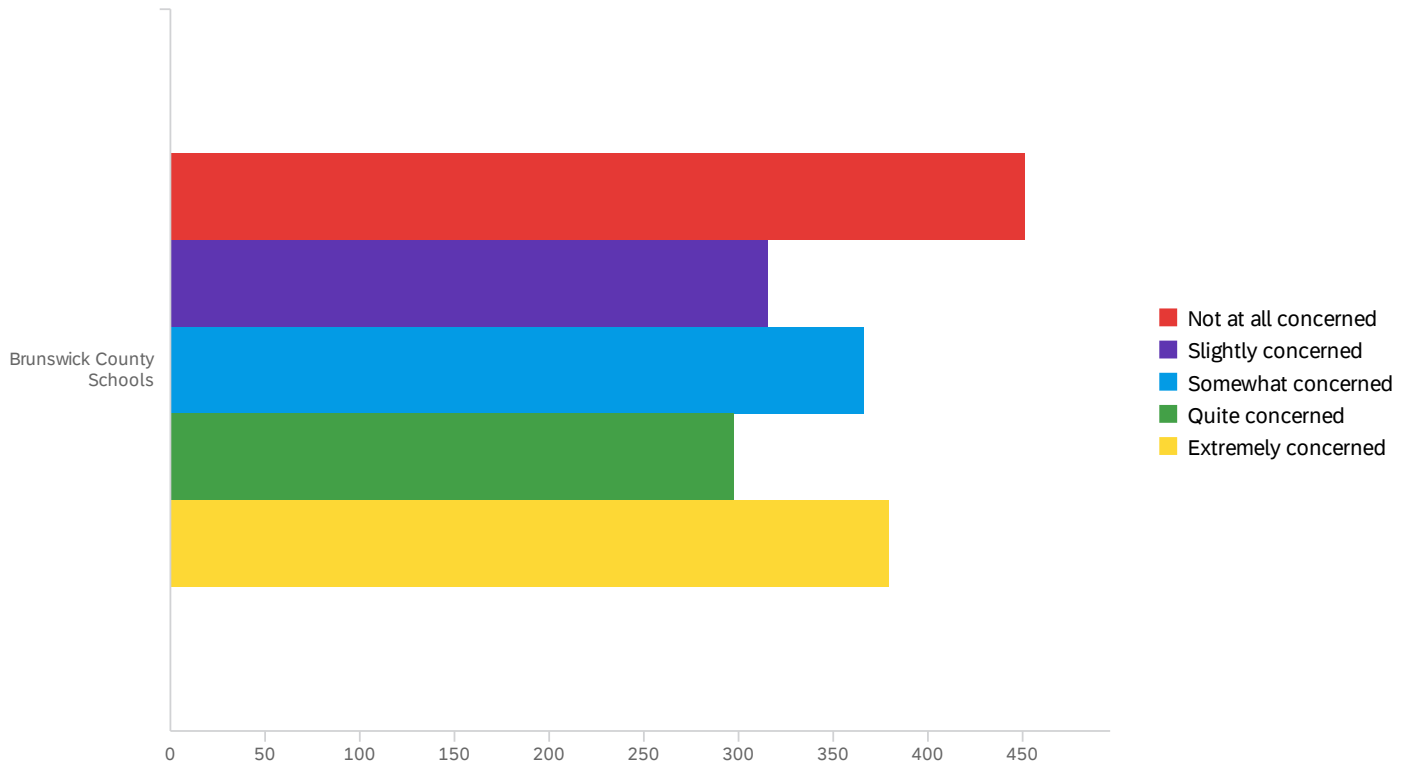

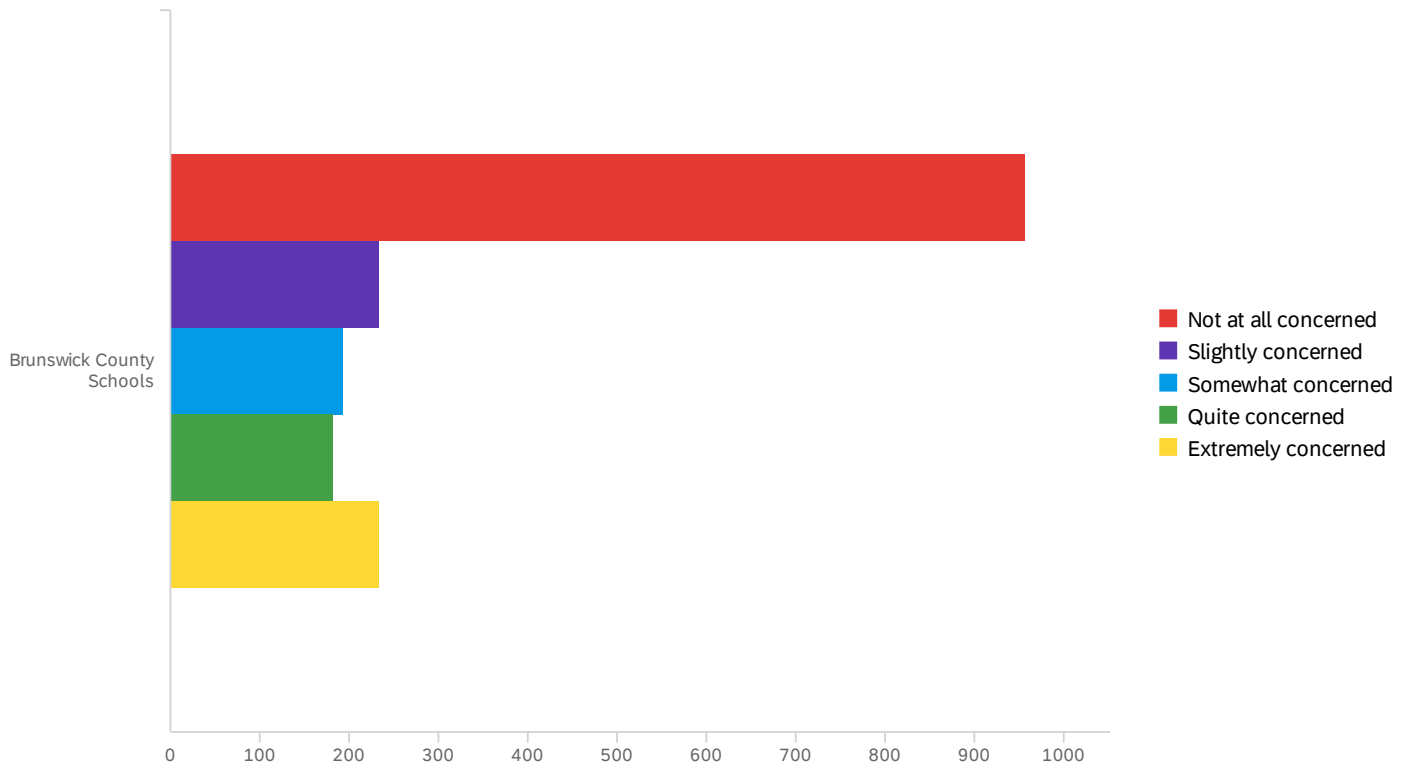

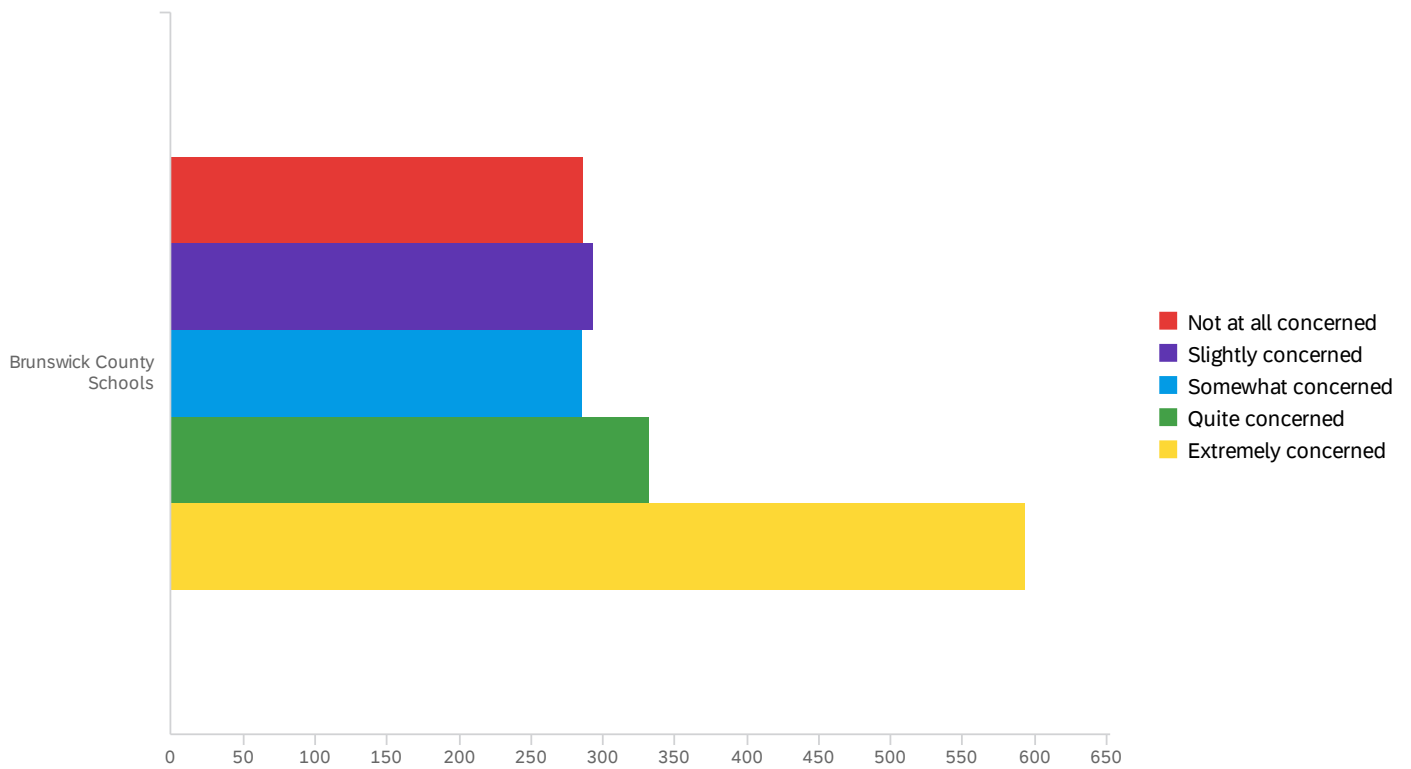
How concerned are you about your students's social or emotional well-being?

Teach new material, require work to be completed, uphold accountability of students.

Offer the option of virtual learning until covid is over so we're not worrying about what's going to happen all the time. Starting and stopping over and over is confusing plus kids have fears of covid. Also my in-laws are my primary source of child care, they're in their late 70s. I don't want to send my kid to school and have to keep her away from the grandparents. It's like do I choose school or seeing the grandparents. There are many grandparents currently raising their grandchildren.

I think a little more communication between teacher and parents

Teachers need to know how best to communicate with the families they work with. Not everyone lives on social media to read mass updates. The online grading system would have been good to see what assignments were being learned that week and the work to turn in outlined. None of this was available and if it were for parents, I have no idea where it was. This would be a good asset for all even when school goes back to pre-covid. We didn't always live in Brunswick Cty and our prior school had a website for every teacher of the school. The teachers updated the week's lessons and what parents should anticipate. I've never seen anything like this here. The apps are great to shoot texts about reminders, but I don't know that they are utilized well for lessons/assignments; or if they even could be.

I was working from home while my daughter was remote learning as well. Some teachers responded to emails when I had questions regarding an assignment, but one teacher never responded. In the future if remote learning continues a plan for how parents can be involved/in contact with teachers too would be helpful.

Don't forget about your athletes that are driven and motivated to do well in order to play sports.

I feel this is a very difficult time and my student's high school was very supportive and accommodating to any need we brought to their attention.

Make sure teachers TEACH. We didn't hear from teacher for weeks at a time. She should have been in contact with children everyday teaching lessons daily. Very disappointed with remote learning.

If remote learning continues accountability needs to be implemented among teachers and students. If students don't get on a zoom meeting and be in attendance than how can you get a grade. During this time, I had to renew my real estate license and I did 2 separate 4 hour zoom meetings. You had to be in attendance and participation to get the credits. If the students can be held accountable for being in attendance that can help with their grade and maybe get extra credit for participating in discussions.

Remote learning was a challenge, but after a week or so most caught on. High schoolers are more independent and know to do their work.

Coordinate with area childcare centers to provide remote learning. Understand that working parents are not able to support remote learning realistically. Understand that not all child can learn and engage remotely and need in person social interaction for learning.

Give us more information on how to access the websites as an adult

Have some printable or physical packets also to vary it.

The best way to support remote learning is to require core teachers to have daily interaction with students. During the spring 2020 fourth quarter, there were some teachers who provided lesson plans daily, and a few who were heard from once a week, if at all. If a teacher is eager to participate, it segues to the student's eagerness to accomplish the tasks.

Require teachers to push out new lesson plans and teach new work, not busy work based on material they already know.

Communication with parents even for the older students!

Now that there has been more time to plan I would expect a clear plan for instruction is shared with parents, what to teach when and how to set up a schedule for the day. I would expect more direct interaction between the student and the teacher. I would also expect the teacher to be able to adjust the curriculum based on the scores and progress of each individual child if remote learning is used for 2020-2021.

Clear expectations and adequate information to make informed decisions as parents as to what requirements are being communicated and actually "carry weight" in their academic record. While our family is likely unique in it's background with online education, it is important to present a confident informed front if the district chooses to include this as an ongoing option. The perception was that no one actually had experience or a clear grasp of how top transition to this learning format - which led to low confidence in adopting it on the part of parents in our circle.

Doing a good job, other than the work they are doing needs to be graded. Teachers bragged about how well she did at getting her work done but they said alot of the kids wasnt participating. If they was getting graded they would have to check in everyday and do their work.

Just make sure to keep in touch through remind of assignments

The school has done all it can for the students and their families. We have no complaints at all.

I think it would be great if teachers would live stream lessons so that it would be like kids are at school and not just in front of a computer. We were not given any spelling words although while physically at school they received words weekly. We had to find our own words to learn and for parents that are not teachers and are also working remotely, at least the schools and staff can give us the tools we need to teach our kids during the school year.

Flexible scheduling and not all families can "do school" and attend meet as at the same times. For example we would need zoom meetings in the evening when parents could supervise. We can't quit our jobs and stay at home to become teachers and supervise. My student does not have to zoom with only his teacher at a specified time. I would consider trying it again if it was more like a homeschool charter school...where we had more individualized direction and regular opportunity for 1:1 instruction/coaching from the actual teacher to support us in areas where we really need it-like writing composition/planning and more freedom to follow the students interest where possible and then work standards into that vs. trying to give group assignments/instruction where there really is no group.

Our family setup means both parents work (even through the shut down) we had no really conceivable way to manage the 4ish hours asked of us for online learning. It was unrealistic. We were scrambling daily to find childcare for our school age child and preschool child when all child care centers closed. The assignments my child recieved were more like busy work than actual education. As a 3rd grader, she needed to focus on multiplication, reading comprehension, cursive, etc. We need to get back to the basics.

Give parents a detailed plan of what each lesson needs to be, what the students will be working on each week, each day, each month.....help me help the teacher! I completely understand this and expected no different because of the urgency for setting it up. I do hope that, if we aren't able to resume as normal, a better system is set up. I think the main thing is seeing parents up to where they can follow daily so that we know what they are or are not doing. PowerSchool is great, but most of the time this past semester it wasn't kept up by the teachers. I can say, the one call I received has said there were only three assignments, but her final grade reflected 15 or more assignments. Definitely better communication is going to be needed.

I think my 5th grader really benefited from having 30 minutes of virtual teaching/instruction from the teacher each day.

Keep parents informed of what is going on with expectations and assignments.

The teachers were somewhat helpful but it is not the same if it is not daily instructing. Math and science were difficult for my child learning remotely

I believe the District did everything they could with such short notice. Thank you for your concern for your students. The only issue was some teachers did not respond to emails about questions concerning student work. Emails should be checked throughout the day

High school parents need to be contacted also. I did not know where to go for some of the classes. Other classes I got the remind with what my student was to do and others I had no clue. My student needs to be back in school learning in front of a teacher. They will not or prepared for college and a whole year wasted.

I would love to see an opportunity for students to connect with their educators remotely in a fun way, apart from strictly schoolwork and learning. I'm not sure how that can be accomplished, but I think something that feels less like work and is engaging would be appreciated by my child.

For a student to do less than 2 hours of school work a week counting class lectures for ALL of her classes will yield poor results in the future.

There were not any virtual learning sessions and assignments turned in were reviewed a week to 2 weeks later.

Don't close it. He is in high school. There is no reason high schools should not be back in session. The same thing doesn't need to be done for every grade level. High school students can be made to understand the reasoning for masks and social distancing and if they can't suspend them.

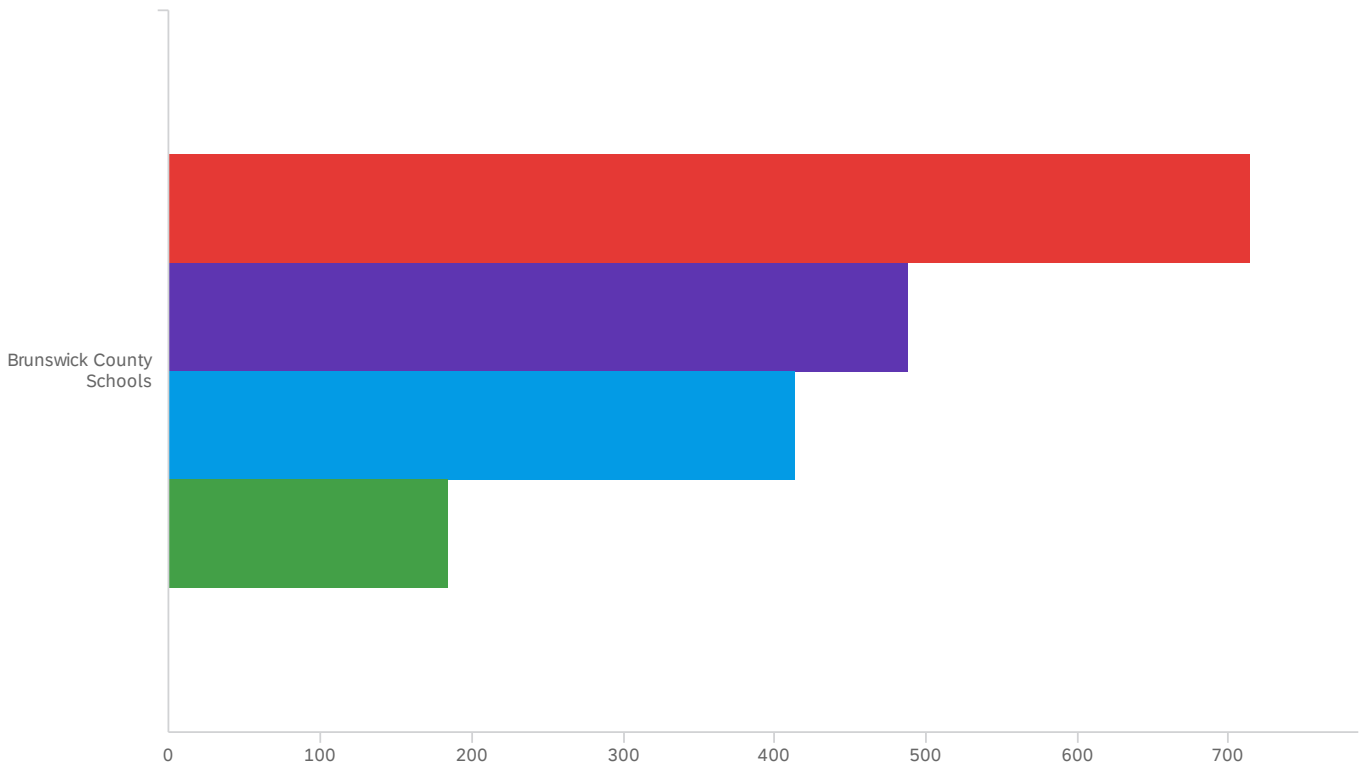

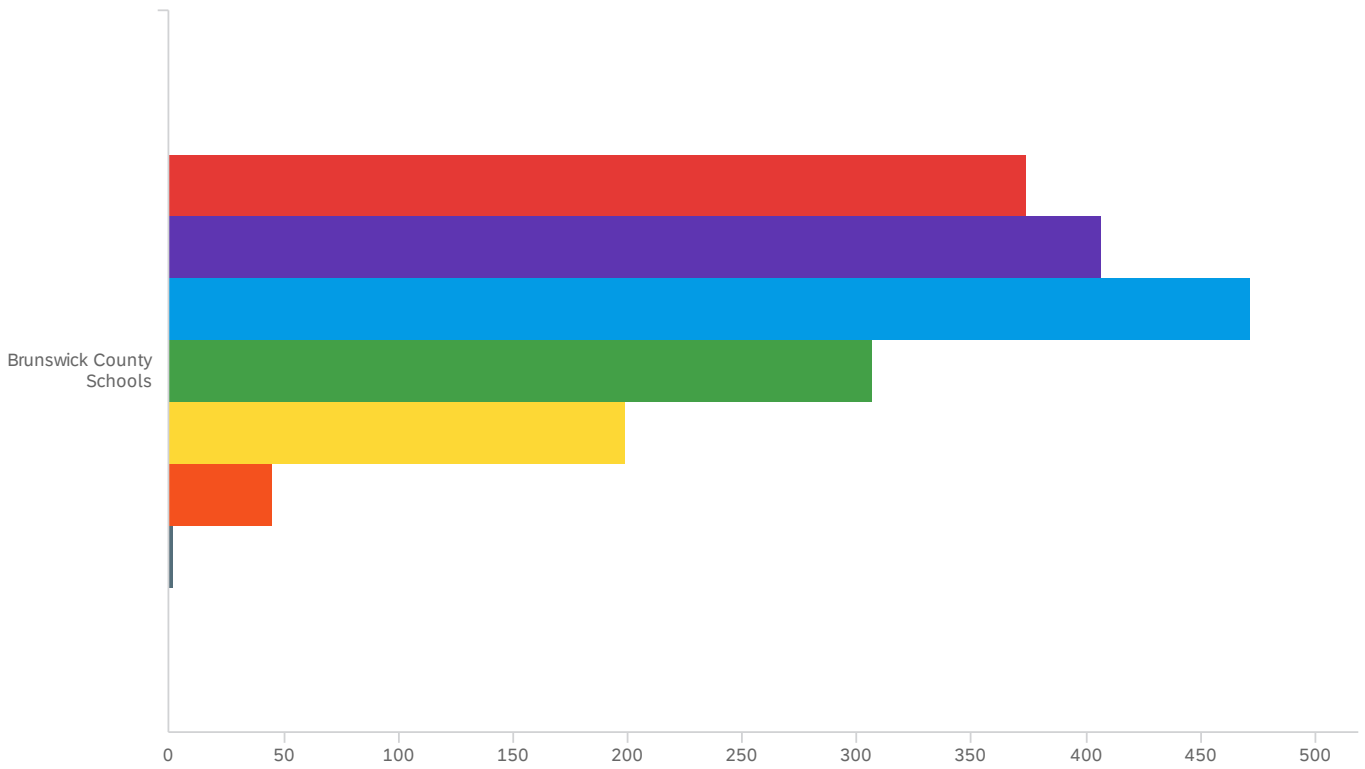

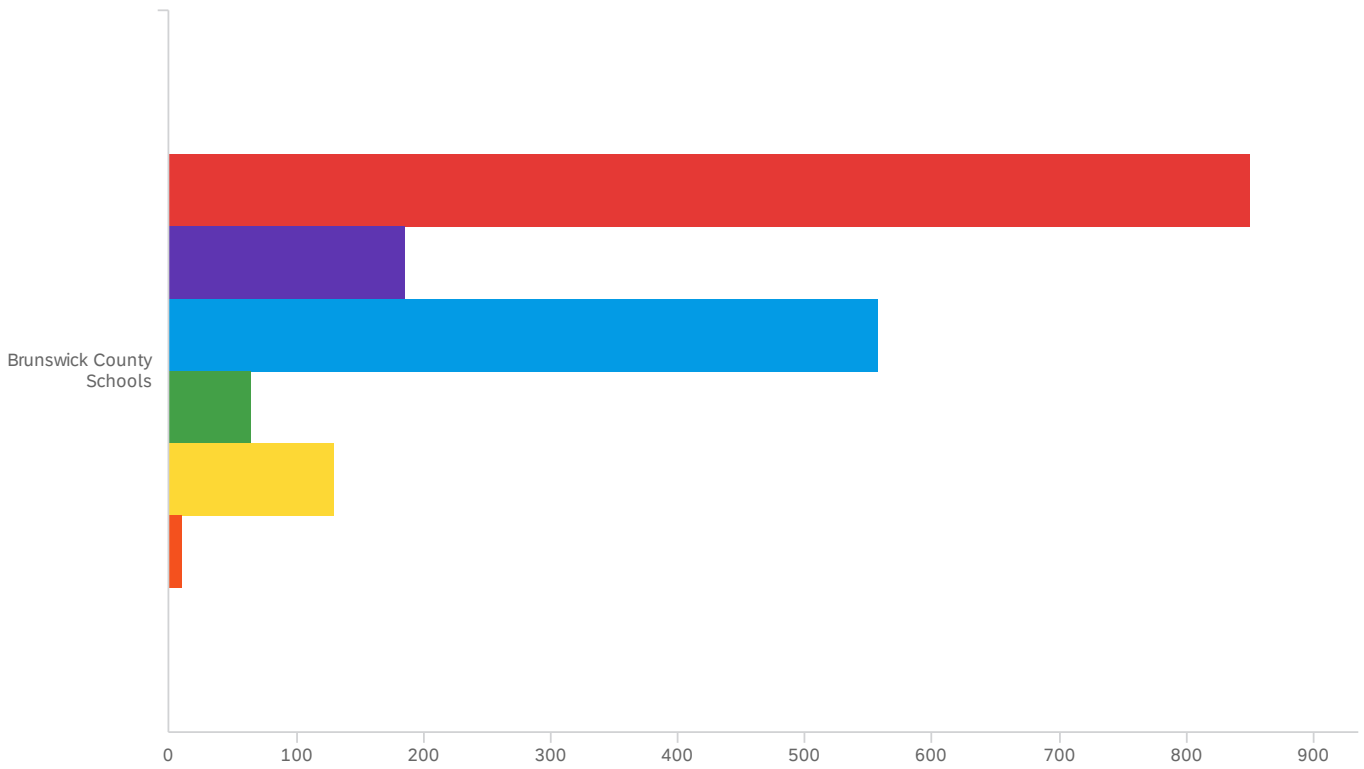
